Indoor / Outdoor:

Throughout the day, Discovery Campers will rotate indoors and outdoors. Please note that we are heat sensitive and will not take campers outside if there is inclement weather. It is important to reference the packing list to make sure your camper is dressed appropriately for both indoor and outdoor play.

During high heat index day's activities / schedule can change as all campers will be inside.

Sprinklers and outside vendors will come in to keep the children cool (waterslides etc.)

Swimming:

Discovery swims 4-5 times a week

Aquatic Supervision Ratios: 1:3 beginners, 1:6 intermediate Curriculum: YMCA Swim Lessons. Safety (ACA and DOH regulations) Campers have a swim evaluation conducted on their first day of camp Campers receive a color-coded swim cap based on their swim level Buddy checks conducted every 15 minutes
